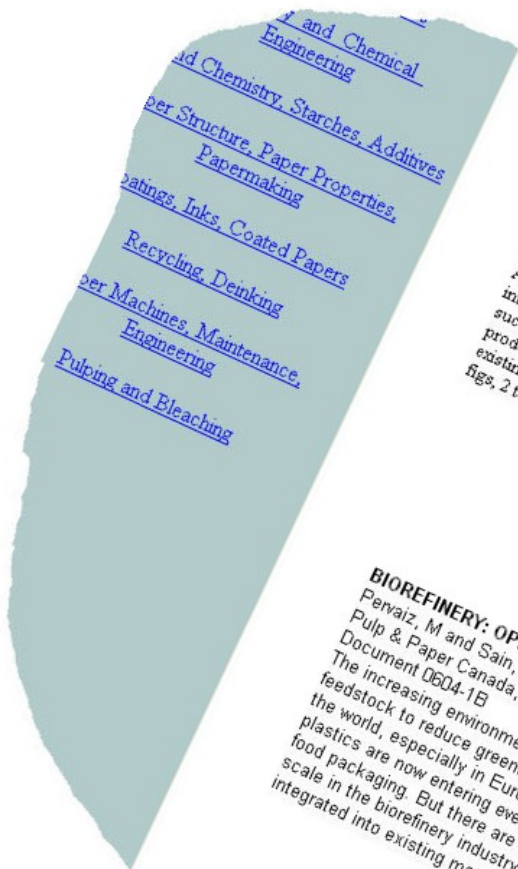

The increasing environmental concerns have forced the petroleum-based plastic industry to explore renewable feedstock to reduce greenhouse gases. As a result, biodegradable plastics have attracted the attention around the world, especially in Europe and USA with significant growth over last decade. Biodegradable polymers and plastics are now entering every sector of traditional plastic applications, particularly growing fast in industrial and food packaging. But there are some technical and commercial roadblocks to overcome to achieve the economical scale in the biorefinery industry. A feasible strategy in the current scenario is to develop renewable technologies integrated into existing manufacturing infrastructures. (4 figs, 2 tables)
